The Annual Meeting of the Wissett Parish Council was held on Thursday, 19th May 2016 in the village hall. This is the yearly opportunity for all residents to ask questions and raise concerns. No one other than the Councillors and the Clerk attended. The Chairman's report on the past year is on www.wissett.onesuffolk.net

The Parish Council met immediately following the Annual Meeting.

Hannah Pretty and Matthew Wetmore were re-elected Chairman and vice-chairman.

Overgrown verge between Beck Cottage and Mill Road. No one knew the ownership. [surely, County Council - Ed] The Parish Council will coppice it to try to make it safer.

Car park. Additional low-level lighting to be installed soon.

Legal work on the land near Rumburgh is proceeding.

Buntings Lane. Suffolk County Council will not make up the road. If residents and Waveney District Council were paying for improvement the County Council might make a modest contribution.

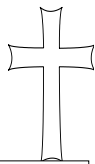
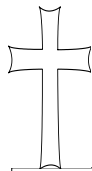

NEWS FROM ST. ANDREW'S CHURCH

A busy time of year from Good Friday onwards. Spring cleaning was fun, and we thank all those who came and worked very hard making a big difference to a building that is difficult to clean. It really looked fresh at the end of it. The churchyard looks different too as cutting and strimming has resumed, on Friday evenings.

Rogation tide, this year coinciding with the start of the great growth spurt, was marked by the traditional and popular Walk from Spexhall to Wissett, and the tea afterwards. Then the Round Tower Churches Society visited Wissett on its annual tour, and about 45 people came to study the structure, and clamber up to the first stage to see the rare ancient floor. Alan Witherby kindly organised the successful Plant Sale, the first fund-raising event of the season

The Annual Parochial Church Meeting, the essential and legal organisational event, dealt with the business more rapidly than usual. The PCC was re-elected en bloc, there being no new volunteers. Anne Andrews retired after many years as secretary, and Richard Tomkin has taken over.

The next special event is the Queen's 90th Birthday weekend, 11th - 12th June. There will be an exhibition in the church illustrating the life of St. Andrew's in each of the nine decades since 1926. Cream Teas will be available in the village hall on Sunday afternoon, 2 till 5, followed by Choral Evensong at 6.30 p.m..

A hundred years ago, on July 1st 1916, the offensive on the Somme began, and two days later the 7th Battalion of the Suffolks attacked the strongly fortified village of Ovillers, northeast of Albert. Among them was L/Cpl Arthur Kemp, a Wissett's bell-ringer: he was killed, and is buried in the cemetery there. One of the bells that he rang will be tolled on 3rd July.

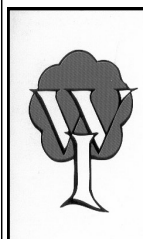
WISSETT CARPET BOWLS
