PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

ANNUAL PARISH MEETING - 18th MAY 2017

This is the meeting to which all adults in the village are invited to hear a report on what the Council has been doing over the past year; and at which they can ask questions and raise issues. The Chairman, Hannah Pretty, gave her annual report.

A representative from Chediston Parish Council asked if Wissett would be interested in joining a pilot scheme to provide activities for village children over the summer holidays. Everyone thought it a good idea and it will be followed up.

A representative from the Village Hall Committee asked the Council for financial help towards a much needed major refurbishment - window and door replacement and repairs made more expensive because of conservation requirements. The council had already agreed in principle but would need to know estimated costs. The Clerk was asked to find out what grants might be available.

ANNUAL PARISH COUNCIL MEETING - this took place at the end of the previous meeting.

Among other matters dealt with were:

Hannah Pretty and Matthew Wetmore were re-elected Chairman and Vice Chairman.

Speed limit controls:

The village will now have the mobile warning traffic lights four times a year. The Police have designated the site opposite the Village Hall for use by volunteers using speed guns.

Village Sign:

A Foundry has been approached to see if a more durable sign might be cast from the wooden one.

Planning Applications:

1. Valley Farm: use as a wedding venue, extension of building, and construction of two lodges . No objection but observations were made about vehicle access and traffic, noise, possible fireworks at weddings, occupation conditions and durations on the lodges, onsite out of hours management, plumbing and power supplies.

2. Bramble Barn Lodge Lane. Construction of detached outbuilding. No objection.

3. Millcroft retrospective approval: No objection subject to Conservation Officer approvals.

4. The Old Stables, The Street. Construction of storage for horse feed and stables. No objection.

Finance: balances: Current account £4,646 Deposit account £27,344

Land at Rumburgh: This is to be offered once more to the tenant.

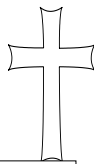
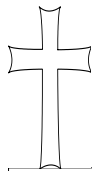
Village allotment site. To be offered once more to the tenant.

NEWS FROM ST ANDREW'S CHURCH

The church is closing – but only for a month or so while it is redecorated. So no services, except Breakfast Church in the Village Hall at 9.30 on 25th June, and no ringing. We do not know exactly when the work will have finished, after which there will have to be a big clean up, but it is likely that the next service in church will be in the middle of July. Meanwhile there are Team services, including the open air Ecumenical Eucharist in Halesworth Market Place at 11.00 on Whitsunday, 4th June, with the Bishop of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and Sung Evensong at Spexhall at 18.30 on 11th June, and of course the opportunity to go to see what they do at other churches in the Team.

We have a new churchwarden, Geoffrey Kiddy, the fifth in his family to fill this office; Valerie Eagle-Bott has retired after 11 years. The rest of the PCC was re-elected en bloc at the Annual Meeting. As always we are faced with more fund-raising, and we are very grateful to everyone who gave their time, goods and plants, and came to support Open Gardens (£700), the Barn Sale (£350), and the Plant Sale (£290). We need about £14,000 a year just to keep going.

The churchyard is now looking very good: Julian's team has been greatly helped by the success of the mole campaign, all in time for the first wedding of this year, on 27th May, when Colin Murphy and Rachel Block came out into hot sunshine.
