PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The Parish Council's Annual Meeting was on Thursday 16th May 2019. Among other matters dealt with were: Hannah Pretty and Matthew Wetmore were re-elected Chair and Vice Chair respectively.

Charity requests.

Requests from the local hospice and the NSPCC were rejected - though Hannah undertook to see if someone locally might organise the coffee morning the NSPCC wanted. It was decided that such requests would in future be considered only if directly related to the parish or its parishioners.

East Suffolk District Council.

Alison Cacket and Tony Goldson, the Parish's representatives on the newly emerged District Council, hold a surgery in Halesworth Library on the second Saturday in each month.

Village sign.

This is in such poor condition that its restoration will cost not far short of the cost of a newly carved sign. Matthew Wetmore will inspect and report.

Brickhill Cottages.

The Council is still trying to find a way to repair the badly surfaced layby and improve access.

Litter Pick.

Waveney Norse - the public works contractor - will be donating £25, a thank you for the work done. This will be given to the Village Hall Fund. There will be another litter pick in October.

The Bridge, Lodge Lane.

Quotations are being sought for repainting the railings.

Traffic mirror opposite Buntings Lane.

A new mirror will be bought subject to a resident installing it.

Grants of £980 for churchyard maintenance and £100 for the Wissett Web were made.

Weed killers.

A resident had expressed concern at the possibility of waterways being contaminated by herbicides such as "Round Up". Waveney Norse had stated that the weed killer they used was classed as "non toxic". Their relevant staff were NPTC trained and certified.

NEWS FROM ST. ANDREW'S CHURCH

Edward Rennard is slowly recovering at home, but he is not able to work, and the whole team, with great gratitude, continues to rely on Jane Held and the 'retired' clergy for many services, and Jane Held and Carolyn Clarke for organisation and administration. In June we have **only one service in Wissett, which is Breakfast Church on 23rd**, because there is the open-air Ecumenical Pentecost Service at Holton at 10.30 a.m. on Whitsunday, 9th, and the Relicensing of Elders at 10.00 a.m. on 16th, at Halesworth, as well as the usual Team Services on 2nd and 30th. **At Spexhall, there is a Songs of Praise with the team choir at 4.30 p.m. on 16th.** As for July, we cannot say yet, and it is likely that the 'normal pattern of services will not have resumed.

Good news is that Claire Kiddy and Jane Held will both be ordained Priest in the cathedral at Bury St. Edmunds on 29th June, the traditional time, and this year St. Peter's Day itself. On the same day Linda Berry and Alison Alder will be ordained Deacon.

The church looked beautiful with flowers for the marriage of Michael Balls and Anne Aldred on 6th April, then went back to Lenten simplicity, until the equally beautiful Easter flowers. At the Annual Meeting on the 11th April the PCC was re-elected on bloc, with the exception of Maggie Evans who has retired, and Anne Andrews who is 'taking a sabbatical'. Fortunately Susan Fitch has joined the PCC, and now organises the flower rota. Geoffrey Kiddy and I were re-elected churchwardens, and we were duly sworn in on 22nd May. Earlier the same day we held the funeral service of Jo Aldridge, who was born in the Swan when it was kept by his parents: history recorded in the invaluable volume, *A Walk through Wissett*.

Finally, we heard that Michael Doherty died at home on 22nd May. In Mary's care throughout his distressing illness.

WISSETT CARPET BOWLS



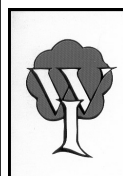
