The Parish Council held a special planning meeting on September 10th. Under consideration was a planning application for an additional static caravan on the existing site at the Wissett Plough.

The Parish Council resolved to approve the application with reservations sent to the District Council Planning Department.

The reservations were these:

- i) the development would be for a maximum of 5 years.
- ii) the unit would be for holiday use only.

WISSETT COMMUNITY COUNCIL

WCC met on August 30th to finalise arrangements for the Wissett commemoration of the end of WW1 and to arrange a winter programme.

Wooden cut-outs, to represent the soldiers who died, made by Julian Harris, would be placed in appropriate places round the village from October 11th, as near as is known to where the individuals lived, . They would be brought to positions outside the church nearer to November 11th, Armistice Day.

It was thought that they might be "fostered " after the event to anyone who would like them.

The village sign would be decorated appropriately.

Brian Howard would build and light the beacon fire.

A bugler would sound the Last Post and Reveille.

There would be soup and rolls afterwards in the village hall.

A leaflet would be distributed to all residents during October telling them of arrangements ..

The Parish Council would donate £500 towards costs.

Village Quiz with Fish and Chip supper to be on March 9th, 2019.

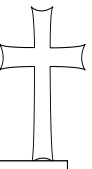
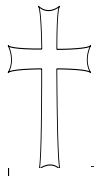

NEWS FROM ST ANDREW'S CHURCH

We were very pleased to welcome the Bishop of Dunwich to preach at Harvest Festival, and to the very enjoyable Supper afterwards. The system was slightly different this year, and Geoffrey carved the ham at a very fast rate so that we could start more or less together. The next day was the Historic Churches Bike Ride, with the Sutton family representing Wissett, and also Gift Day: so far more than £2,000 has come in from generous donations.

On All Souls Day, Friday 2nd November, from 5 to 7 p.m. we welcome all who would like to have quiet time in the candlelit church to think of those who have died, especially our friends and family.

Sunday 11th November is Remembrance Sunday and the Centenary of the Armistice that marked the beginning of the end of the Great War. There will be the usual Remembrance Service at 10.45 a.m.. The Wissett commemoration is in the evening, and our contribution is an informal programme of readings and music in the church from 6.00 to 6.45 p.m., probably candlelit, a chance to gather before going up to the bonfire, which the Community Council is organising. We then all go down from the bonfire for soup and other refreshments in the hall. There is an effort to ring every bell in the country at some stage, which will require every available ringer, and timing arrangements between the towers in the Team.

St Andrew the fisherman is the Patron of Wissett as well as of Scotland, and we have our **Festival Eucharist at 7 p.m. on his day, Friday 30th November**, followed by fishy refreshments.

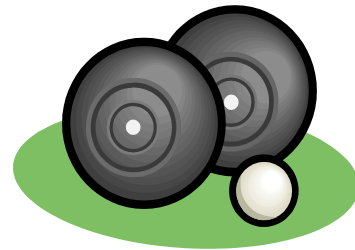
